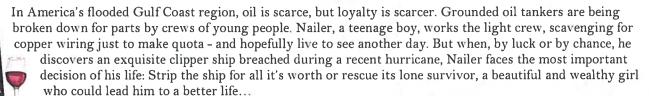
#### Zumba Gold
