Basehor Community Library is embarking on an interview collection project, inspired by StoryCorps, to record and preserve the stories of community members. We want to offer our community the opportunity to share and preserve personal stories on video, assuring your stories will not be forgotten.



The chance to record an interview for **"We All Have a Story"** is also a chance to

ask someone you know about their life. Individuals can bring in a friend, colleague, or loved one to interview. Or you can choose to be interviewed yourself; to tell your own story. For 20 minutes, you can talk about whatever you want. We can provide the questions or you can come prepared with your own questions or story.

The library is working with the assistance of the **Tady Brothers Productions** who will handle all things technical. At the end of your conversation, you'll receive a free video recording on a flash drive to share with family and friends. The library will not keep a copy of your recording.



Circe by Madeline Miller

A bold and subversive retelling of the goddess's story.



In the house of Helios, god of the sun and mightiest of the Titans, a daughter is born. But Circe has neither the look nor the voice of divinity and is scorned and rejected by her kin. Increasingly isolated, she turns to mortals for companionship, leading her to discover a power forbidden to the gods: witchcraft. But she will not always be alone; many are destined to pass through Circe's place of exile, entwining their fates with hers, including the messenger god, Hermes, and wily Odysseus, on his epic voyage home.

Breathing life into the ancient world, Madeline Miller weaves an intoxicating tale of gods and heroes, magic and monsters, survival and transformation. *Circe* was a New York Times bestseller and was named one of the best books of the year by NPR, People, Amazon and Time. Book T.A.L.K. (Talk About Literature in Kansas)


Our fall series is titled *Between Fences*. "Good fences make good neighbors," Robert Frost famously declared in his poem "Mending Wall," but not all fences do. Fences mark our territory, define our boundaries, limit our movement, and convey our sense of property.

Metaphorically, fences can mark different states of being – ins and outs, the included and excluded, the sacred and taboo, and even life and death.

This fall we will read and discuss three books that explore the theme of fences and the living on one side or the other.


Zumba Gold
