

Jim Cosgrove: On the Trail of a Cold Case Wednesday, June 21 @ 6:30 pm

While working as a feature writer for the Albuquerque Journal in 1995, storyteller Jim Cosgrove picked up the trail of a cold case involving the disappearance of a family friend, Frank McGonigle, a lovable, hapless Grateful Dead fan who left his Kansas City home in 1982 and never returned. *Ripple*, which gives a nod to the 1970 Grateful Dead song, is the culmination of this long, strange journey in which Cosgrove uncovers connections to a ruthless local crime boss in South Carolina and miscues from a threadbare sheriff's department. A chance meeting with a soft-

hearted psychic who provides freakishly accurate details about Frank's death puts Cosgrove face to face with the alleged killer.

This program is part of the One Book, Many Neighbors series, but you don't need to be signed up for the series to attend the program. If you are signed up, however, stay after the program for a discussion of the short story "Six Letter Word for Neighbor" by Lisa Unger, from the book "When A Stranger Comes to Town."

After years of silence, Marra is done watching her suffer at the hands of a powerful and abusive prince. Seeking help for her rescue mission, Marra is offered the tools she needs, but only if she can complete three seemingly impossible tasks:

build a dog of bones, sew a cloak of nettles, and capture moonlight in a jar. But, as is the way in tales of princes and witches, doing the impossible is only the beginning.

Hero or not—now joined by a disgraced ex-knight, a reluctant fairy godmother, an enigmatic gravewitch and her fowl familiar—Marra might finally have the courage to save her sister, and topple a throne.
